

**The JFKI Department of History is looking for a doctoral candidate (m/f/d) for the Project "Gender, Borders, Memory" which is part of the Cluster of Excellence "Contestations of the Liberal Script" (SCRIPTS), 13 TV-L FU, 65% part-time position, fixed-term from 01.09.2020 until 31.08.2023**

### **Description:**

The SCRIPTS Project "Gender, Borders, Memory" (GBM) examines the role of gender and memory in the context of borders and border regions in the liberal script. It analyzes to which extent different impressions of gender and gender roles, both past and present, have influenced the development of borders and border conflicts in liberal regimes. The project will research and use a case study of the separatist movement of Catalonia, examining images, symbols, and arguments relating to gender and memory in the in the context of mobilization and protest. The significance of colonial memories, for example, the siege of Barcelona in 1714, the Spanish-American War in 1898, or the Catalanian suffrage movement in the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century will play a central role in the analysis of the search for Catalanian self-determination from a gender-specific perspective.

The SCRIPTS Cluster of Excellence offers an attractive academic environment and expertise in regional studies, world history, and political economy, as well as financial support for archival and conference travel. As an affiliated member of the Berlin Graduate School for Global and Transregional Studies (BGTS), the chosen candidate will have a connection to an active community of young researchers at the Cluster.
